“I hope you find it is interesting experimental speculative fiction from Tasmania.

“It’s been download over 9000 times as a PDF file, so basically the threat of paying for a hardcopy (with a pseudoe-event release date to boot) means that digitally speaking, the hardcopy is an advert for the PDF. The advert is the product. The product has become the advert.

“The PDF also has less errors than the hardcopy (two less typos, one quite important on the very last page).

The seven tells in **.before Country** recount early experiences on a newly settled planet.

The last story *The Isle of the Dead* recounts an accidental transformation. John Smith retraces the journey of a namesake made several centuries before, the journal of which he discovered in an ancient buried bookroom. He finds his way to the island aboard a yawl crewed by old lags. Following the notes Smith finally reaches a seamark. Its touching power, somewhat missing in the earlier tells, ends up saving the small, young world. This prepared the way for Starkey and her founded of Ripplinglee, the first steadhouse.

.before Country sets the scene to the forthcoming *Books of Country (Fall, Born, Home)* which best describe the time of the steaders and their steadhouser lives. This trilogy will be release some time in the future.
